### Recent Developments in International Arbitration: Swiping Left and Swiping Right



### Mr Gary Born

Chair of the International Arbitration Practice Group at Wilmer Cutler Pickering Hale and Dorr LLP

Mr Gary Born is the chair of the International Arbitration Practice Group at Wilmer Cutler Pickering Hale and Dorr LLP. Mr Born is widely regarded as the world's preeminent authority on international commercial arbitration and international litigation. He has been ranked for more than 20 years as one of the world's leading international arbitration advocates and the leading arbitration practitioner in London.

Mr Born has participated as counsel in more than 675 international arbitrations, including four of the largest ICC arbitrations and several of the most significant ad hoc arbitrations in recent history.

Mr Born has published a number of leading works on international arbitration, international litigation and other forms of dispute resolution. He is the author of International Commercial Arbitration (Third Edition, Kluwer 2020), the leading treatise in the field, which has received the American Society of International Law's Certificate of Merit for High Technical Craftsmanship and OGEMID's Book of the Year award for 2009. He is an Honorary Professor of Law at the University of St Gallen, Switzerland and Tsinghua University, Beijing, and teaches regularly at law schools in Europe, Asia and North and South America.

# GETTING TO CAMBRIDGE

CAD 2024 will be held in Jesus College, University of Cambridge. The following is provided by the website of Jesus College to assist you in planning your visit.

#### By rail

A regular train service runs to Cambridge from London's Kings Cross Station, London Liverpool Street Station, and many other mainline UK stations.

The College is located approximately 2 miles (3.2 kilometres) from the railway station. Buses run about every 10 minutes and there is a taxi rank outside the station. Taxis cost around £10.

#### By air

The nearest airport is Stansted (c 32 miles / 51km). Heathrow is approximately 71 miles / 114km away, and Gatwick 96 miles / 154km.

There are regular train services between Cambridge and Stansted. National Express operates bus services between Cambridge and all three airports mentioned above.

#### By bus or coach

The Drummer Street bus station is within walking distance of the College. For information about coach services to Cambridge please see the National Express or Stagecoach websites.


#### By road or on foot

For pedestrians or those alighting from buses or taxis it is best to use the Jesus Lane entrance. Cars should use the <u>electronic gates on Victoria Avenue</u>, where assistance is provided through an intercom.

General guest parking is not offered in College. If you or a passenger need to use our on-site parking for accessibility reasons, please <u>contact</u> the College in advance to request a space. There are several <u>public car parks</u> within walking distance. There are also various <u>Park and Ride</u> schemes if you would prefer to not drive into central Cambridge.
